

## Kisan Diwas organized at Tejrasar (Bikaner)

ICAR-Central Institute for Arid Horticulture (CIAH), Bikaner, organized Kisan Diwas (Farmers' Day) celebration on December 23, 2024, at Tejrasar village in Bikaner district.
